A collective letter from Iranian students

addressed to Muslim students and organizations across the Islamic world;
on the eve of the blessed month of Ramadan and International Women's Day (March 8).

In the Name of God, the Most Compassionate, the Most Merciful

For what sin were they killed?

Awakened students of the Islamic world;

You are the inheritors of a tradition of justice-seeking under the banner of the Messenger of God (peace and blessings be upon him), a tradition that will not rest until oppression is uprooted from the earth. You are the youth who have not sold your conscience in the marketplace of greed, and who believe that history can be reclaimed from the grip of tyrants. Today, a naked crime is unfolding before the eyes of the world.

Over past decades, hundreds of thousands of women in this region have fallen victim to crimes, occupations, and sieges. Women who were each the pillar of a life — mothers, daughters, wives — each with great dreams in their hearts. The Qur'an raised this question centuries ago:

«وَإِذَا الْمَوْءُودَةُ سُئِلَتْ ، بِأَيِّ ذَنْبٍ قُتِلَتْ؟»

“And when the buried girl is asked: for what sin was she killed?”

Today, that question is addressed to us. The girls beneath the rubble, the mothers under siege, the children amid fire and ashes — they are the ‘buried daughters’ of our age. The question still echoes in our ears and in the conscience of the world: For what sin were they killed?

Today we all see and recognize the killer. The Zionist regime, led by Netanyahu, with the weapons, support, and design of the United States and Western powers, has perpetrated this crime. Now we ask: Do those who made this slaughter possible through arms and political backing have any right to speak of women's rights and human dignity? These bloodstains are not merely the result of a war; they are the outcome of a global network that politically, militarily, and economically sustains a criminal regime. The path toward normalizing this crime must be blocked. No political or economic relationship with the supporters of this massacre is legitimate.

No transaction should pass over the blood of the women of this region. The most fundamental right of women is not a calendrical slogan on March 8, but the end of the killings and the

accountability of their perpetrators and their backers. We will no longer allow any occasion — no international day, no conference, no statement — to be held without an explicit demand for accountability from those who have killed and committed crimes against these martyred women. International Women's Day has too often been aligned with the agendas of the very powers responsible for the suffering of women in this region, reduced to an instrument for advancing Western political projects regarding women.

This year, as it coincides with Ramadan and the Nights of Decree, we make a renewed covenant:

We will not submit to a depoliticized celebration while the red blood of our sisters still flows upon the ground.

Any occasion that seeks to cover over the blood of the women of this region will be met with our organized protest and our resounding voice.

From today, wherever you are: In the university, in the dormitory, in the classroom, in student associations and gatherings Expose political, economic, academic, and cultural ties with the Zionist regime and its supporters. Identify and name the companies, institutions, universities, and programs that cooperate in any way with this regime. Do not allow any relationship with this regime to be normalized; let no collaboration remain without question or protest. On Instagram, Twitter, TikTok, and other social media platforms, under the hashtag #WeWillNotLetGo, we will expose the hidden and overt ties of Israel within our countries.

We, Muslim sisters and brothers, stand as seekers of justice for the martyred women. Let all know: as long as innocent blood is shed, as long as the killers are not held accountable, as long as mothers sit in mourning — every day is Women's Day. And it is the Muslim women of this region who stand in the field, with bloodied fists, face to face with their oppressors.
